1. Parent-School Agreement

1.1 Requirements

The Spanish School of Abu Dhabi (SSAD) requires all parents to sign a Parent-School Agreement:

1.2 Parent Code of Conduct

Parents agree to:

PARENT-SCHOOL AGREEMENT School Year 2024-2025

The Spanish School of Abu Dhabi believes that clarity and transparency are essential to a constructive partnership between the school and families. This partnership aims to provide a nurturing educational experience centered on the child's wellbeing and development. This Parent-School Agreement has been introduced to foster a supportive and collaborative relationship between the school and parents. Additionally, the school has established procedures to address parental concerns and shared the student code of conduct to ensure a harmonious environment.

The school commits to working closely with parents to support each child's learning journey, ensuring a positive and productive relationship. In return, we expect parents to adhere to the following code of conduct, underscoring the shared responsibility for each child's education and personal growth.

4. Supporting Your Child's Education and Wellbeing

- 4.1. Embrace the Multilingual Vision:** Support the school's vision for a multilingual learning environment by actively engaging in your child's practice of English, Spanish, and Arabic through consistent home learning activities.
- 4.2. Prepare Your Child for Learning:** Ensure that your child arrives at school each day well-prepared, bringing necessary materials, wearing the correct uniform, and ready to engage in learning activities.
- 4.3. Recognize Shared Responsibility:** Understand that the education and wellbeing of each child are a shared responsibility between the school and family. Commit to fulfilling your role in this partnership by ensuring your child engages in home learning, gets adequate sleep, consumes nutritious foods, and participates in regular physical activity.
- 4.4. Communicate Issues Promptly:** Notify the school immediately if there are any issues, changes, or concerns that might impact your child's learning or behavior, including family matters, medical conditions, or emotional changes.
- 4.5. Spanish Language Support for Late Starters:** If your child is enrolling in grade 3 or above and lacks the foundational Spanish language skills required to access the curriculum effectively or is not a native Spanish speaker, commit to providing supplementary Spanish language support. This may involve enrolling your child in extracurricular Spanish classes offered by the school's Spanish Language Center or arranging private tuition.
- 4.6. Ensure Attendance and Punctuality:** Make your child's attendance and punctuality a top priority, adhering strictly to school hours and avoiding holidays outside of official school breaks. As per ADEK policies, any absence rate exceeding 5% for primary and secondary students or 10% for KG students is identified as a "cause for concern" and requires monitoring. Only specific absences, are considered "authorized." Unexcused absences or those not meeting ADEK's criteria may result in further actions by the school to ensure compliance with attendance standards.

- 4.7. Uphold School Policies and Guidelines:** Respect and uphold the school's policies and guidelines on behavior, dress code, and technology use. Support the school's efforts to create a structured, respectful, and safe environment for all students by ensuring your child understands and follows these policies consistently.
- 4.8. Respect School's Disciplinary Policy:** Accept that the school's disciplinary policy applies to all students on school premises, during school events, or whenever they are representing the school. This includes understanding that the school may take necessary disciplinary actions to maintain a positive and secure learning environment.
- 4.9. Guide Responsible Behavior:** Teach and guide your child to manage their behavior responsibly, especially in situations that could lead to conflict, compromise safety, or disrupt the learning experience of others. Encourage respect for peers, school staff, and the school community.
- 4.10. Monitor Technology Use:** Actively oversee your child's use of technology, including online interactions and social media. Encourage responsible digital behavior and seek guidance if necessary.
- 4.11. Engage with the School Community:** Attend scheduled parent-teacher meetings and participate in regular communication with teachers and school staff to stay informed about your child's progress, achievements, and areas for growth.
- 4.12. Support Additional Learning Needs:** Cooperate with the school's recommendations for additional learning support if it is deemed necessary for your child's educational development. Be open to suggestions from teachers and specialists, understanding that additional support can provide targeted assistance to help your child succeed.

5. Engaging Respectfully with the School Community

- 5.1. Respect the School's Vision and Values:** Honor the vision, mission, and values of the school, as well as all policies associated with this agreement, and demonstrate a commitment to fostering a respectful and supportive school community.

- 5.4. Work Constructively to Resolve Concerns:** Collaborate with school staff to address concerns, following appropriate channels, and aim for peaceful, constructive resolutions to any disputes. Use designated communication pathways to ensure concerns are handled in a timely and respectful manner.
- 5.5. Follow School Communication Channels:** Set a positive example in speech and conduct, particularly when addressing concerns or providing feedback. Use the school's official communication channels and maintain a respectful tone in all communications. Please remember that, while parent-created WhatsApp groups can be useful for informal coordination, they are not managed or endorsed by the school.



- 5.6. Support School Leadership and Teachers:** Respect and support the decisions of teachers and school leadership. Kindergarten

The purpose of Early Childhood Education is to contribute to the comprehensive and harmonious development of students in all dimensions: physical, emotional, affective, social, cognitive, and artistic. It aims to promote personal autonomy and the progressive creation of a positive and balanced self-image, as well as education in civic values for coexistence.

During this stage, gradual attention will be given to emotional development, emotional management, movement and body control habits, communication and language expressions, basic guidelines for coexistence and social relationships, as well as the discovery of the environment, living beings that coexist within it, and the physical and social characteristics of their surroundings. Values education, education for responsible and sustainable consumption, and health promotion and education will also be included. Additionally, it will encourage children to acquire personal autonomy and develop a positive, balanced, equal self-image, free from discriminatory stereotypes.

Primary

The purpose of Primary Education is to facilitate students' learning in oral and written language, reading, writing, calculation, logical and mathematical skills, basic cultural knowledge, and habits of coexistence, study and work, artistic sense, creativity, and affectivity. Its aim is to ensure comprehensive education that contributes to the full development of their personality and prepares them for the successful completion of Compulsory Secondary Education.

During this stage, the integration of different experiences and learning of students will be sought from a global perspective, adapting to their working rhythms.

Organizational, methodological, and curricular measures adopted for this purpose will be guided by the principles of Universal Design for Learning. Special emphasis will be placed on attending to the diversity of students, providing individualized attention, preventing learning difficulties, and implementing appropriate reinforcement mechanisms.

Secondary

The purpose of Secondary Education is to offer students the opportunity to combine their intellectual advancements with the development of communicative and social skills while maintaining academic rigor. This stage aims to ensure that every student, according to their individual abilities and characteristics, with an inclusive approach, can apply and expand upon the competencies acquired during Primary Education in increasingly complex and diverse contexts.

At this educational level, students are expected to achieve a balance of complexity and personal autonomy that complements the importance of cooperative work. This approach allows students to experience real-world contexts, fostering the ongoing development of their individual personalities. Key aspects include an interdisciplinary vision of knowledge, effective use of diverse information sources to advance research skills, critical analysis and evaluation of learning outcomes, and the promotion of problem-solving and critical thinking.

Moreover, both individual and collective work are encouraged, incorporating various means of communication. Inclusivity is paramount, ensuring that all students, regardless of their abilities, can thrive. The focus on real-world application and effective communication skills prepares students for success in both academic and real-world settings, laying a strong foundation for their future endeavors.

Be Prepared

There is nothing more important than being prepared for school. This information will help you when choosing your child's school belongings. The correct equipment will help your child to be independent within school and will also help them to stay safe around the school campus.

- Backpack:** Your child needs a small backpack which can hold their food/water bottle and bag. Please avoid Trolley bags as these will not fit in your child's satchel.
- Library Bag:** Your child will need the school library bag to take books and documents home.
- Water Bottle:** Every child needs a refillable, reusable water bottle every day. Please do not use disposable water bottles.
- Homework:** Students will be provided with consumable materials such as workbooks and stationery.
- Personal Belongings:** Please label your child's belongings. We have a lost property table where students may be able to find lost items. If items are not collected at the end of each term, these items are either donated or disposed.

Healthy Eating

In order to support effective learning throughout the day, and to promote a well-balanced lifestyle we ask parents to provide healthy lunches and snacks for their children.

WE ENCOURAGE STUDENTS TO HAVE LUNCHBOX CONTENTS WHICH ARE:

- Nutritious and well-balanced (including low saturated fat low processed sugar)
- Child-friendly (no need to use tools)
- Environmentally friendly (less plastic)

WE DISCOURAGE FROM STUDENTS LUNCHES:

- Fizzy / sugar drinks / coffee or hot flavored juices. This includes clear and energy drinks which can contain high levels of caffeine and other additives that are not suitable for children
- Any food requiring a child's assistance

Allergies

- All information and medications are shared by the school and all teachers are informed of their student's medical needs.
- Parents are also required to inform teachers of any medical condition their child may have. Staff take allergies very seriously. Children are taught the importance of this in class and are not allowed to share food.
- If you have a child with an allergy, you need to **obtain the information on your student form**. Please also follow up with the class teacher.
- If you are unable to choose carefully when selecting food for your child's lunch some of our children's allergies are the following:
